(Either spouse can pray)

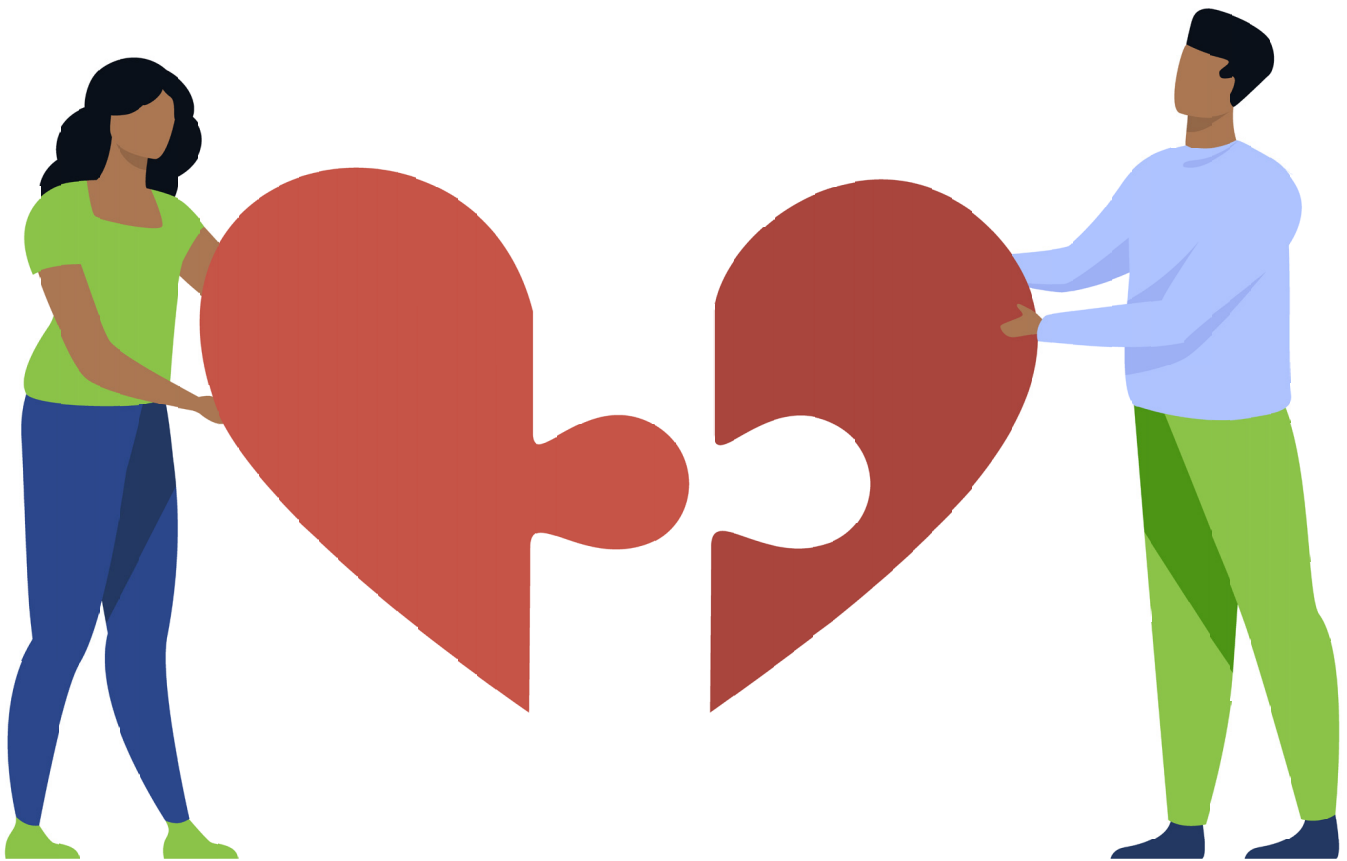
MARRIAGE CHECK-IN: Is there anything that I used to do that you wish I still did? (Be specific & feel free to elaborate)

QUESTION: (aim for about 15 - 20 minutes of conversation) What does the phrase "Intentional Love" mean to you?

BIBLE VERSE:

Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. 5 It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. 6 Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. 7 It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. - 1 Corinthians 13:4-7 NIV

CONVERSATION: We often hear about how hard marriage is and while that can sometimes be true, I challenge you to change that narrative. Does marriage take work? Yes. Can marriage be wildly rewarding? The answer is also, yes! The thing is, you won't just accidentally stumble upon the rewarding part of marriage, it takes intentionality! Intentional Connection, Intentional Communication, and Intentional Prayer! Let's dive into some practical ways to activate intentionality within your marriage.



INTENTIONAL CONNECTION

Identify your spouse's love language

Make Sex A Priority

- Sex with your spouse shouldn't feel like a chore but instead an intimate connection. It's yet another way of communicating "I am yours and you are mine". Sex within marriage is God-designed and should always be mutual and frequent. When a marriage is healthy and you both should feel connected and satisfied. When things get "rocky" within your relationship sex is usually the first thing to go so it's vital to make sure that intimacy is made a priority because a sexless marriage can literally rock a relationship to its core. Below are a few tips to help you make sex a priority in your marriage:

1. Simply put, life gets busy, so schedule sex if you need to!
2. Respect your spouse's need for an emotional connection before a physical connection.
3. Talk openly and honestly with your spouse about what does or doesn't satisfy you sexually. These conversations can be uncomfortable but keep in mind they are also necessary.
4. Don't be afraid to spice it up by trying something new! Try things like creating a storyline, playing truth or dare, or maybe even something as simple as having sex in a place that you've never done it before! You never know what new level of intimacy may be unlocked.
5. If you and your partner are having issues connecting (no matter the reason) there is absolutely no reason to be ashamed. Please consider reaching out to a licensed counselor to help heal that area of your relationship.

Pillow Talk

- Quite honestly "pillow talk" has got to be the most underutilized form of communication within a marriage. Taking advantage of the time of day which is most commonly the calmest to connect and debrief about life, share your feelings or just share a good laugh is unmatched.
