









# **OPENING PRAYER** (2 mins):

Choose one family member to open your time in prayer.

# **FAMILY CHECK-IN** (5-10mins):

What's needed? A bag of Skittles or colorful candy pieces of your choice. Choose one family member to give each member five pieces of candy. Once every family member has their candy, tell them to sort them out by color. Starting with the youngest family member, one-by-one allow each family member to respond to the following prompts:

- Green Use a funny word to describe your day
- Red Dream vacation destination
- Yellow Describe a favorite family memory
- Purple Talk about a fun activity the family does together
- · Orange Share something that worries you

Feel free to enjoy your snacks once you've shared.

## **SCRIPTURE** (5-10mins):

Allow different family members to read a verse.

13 Jesus heard what had happened to John. He wanted to be alone. So he went in a boat to a quiet place. The crowds heard about this. They followed him on foot from the towns. 14 When Jesus came ashore, he saw a large crowd. He felt deep concern for them. He healed their sick people. 15 When it was almost evening, the disciples came to him. "There is nothing here," they said. "It's already getting late. Send the crowds away. They can go and buy some food in the villages." 16 Jesus replied, "They don't need to go away. You give them something to eat." <sup>17</sup> "We have only five loaves of bread and two fish," they answered. 18 "Bring them here to me," he said. 19 Then Jesus directed the people to sit down on the grass. He took the five loaves and the two fish. He looked up to heaven and gave thanks. He broke the loaves into pieces. Then he gave them to the disciples. And the disciples gave them to the people. <sup>20</sup> All of them ate and were satisfied. The disciples picked up 12 baskets of leftover pieces. 21 The number of men who ate was about 5,000. Women and children also ate.

### **SUPPORTING:**

The story found in Matthew 14 provides readers with an opportunity to see Jesus's miraculous side and humane side. Moved by the cries of the people, Jesus takes a moment to address their needs. He healed their sick and fed the entire crowd through a miracle that only he could do. Even after seeking alone time to recover from an emotionally stressful moment, Jesus prioritizing the needs of others is an excellent example of what it means to show love to those in need. Let's use His example as motivation for us to show our love and genuine concen, for those in need.

## **FAMILY CONVERSATION** (10-15 mins)

As a family, how can we meet the NEEDS of a family in NEED? We all have responsibilities but let's explore some creative ways we can support someone in need.

- Random Acts of Kindness Pay for the meal of someone behind you.
- Donate Donate gently used toys and clothes instead of disposing of them.
- Making Cards for an Elderly Family Member
- Volunteer with a company providing food
- Taking the trash cans to the curb for a single mom or elderly neighbor
- Cutting the grass of an elderly neighbor
- Cover Someone's Groceries Pay for the groceries of a family in the store

### **TAKE AWAY:**

Follow Through... Now that you've discussed what to do, DO IT! As a family, decide what task you will do and when. For some families, it will be possible to do multiple tasks. Other families will only be able to do one task at a time. Just remember how important it is for us to "Show Our Love."

### **CLOSING FAMILY PRAYER:**
